**** MAJOR CHANGES TO PARKING ARRANGEMENTS ****

Assembly: Coalville Town Bowls Club (LE67 3FA) within the Council Offices Car Park.

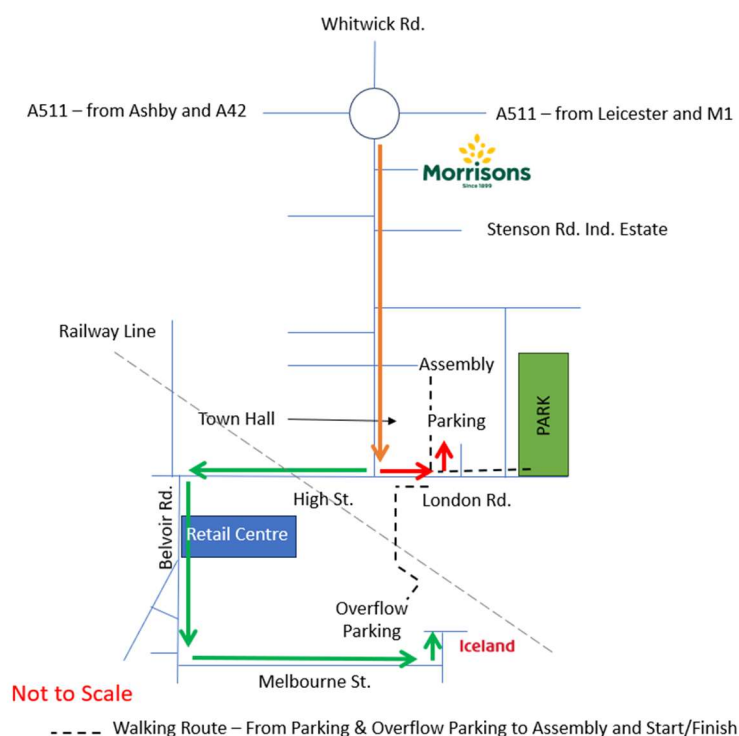
* There is no need to visit assembly before your run – unless you wish to use the toilet. **PLEASE DOWNLOAD IN ASSEMBLY AFTER YOUR RUN.**

Parking: Stenson House Car Park, London Road, LE67 3FN

What-Three-Words: ///locate.banana.noises

Directions: (Following the red arrows on the map below from the A511) Approaching on the A511 from the East or West at the Whitwick Road roundabout take the exit towards Town Centre, Council Offices. Continue down Whitwick Road for 0.4 miles past the Morrisons Superstore and The Victoria Bikers pub, until you reach the junction with London Road at the end of the street, turn left on to London Road and take the 2nd left into Stenson House car park. Parking is free on a Sunday. There are approximately 80 spaces for orienteers and the public.

There is a height restriction at the entrance of ALL council car parks in Coalville, those arriving in vehicles over 6'6ft (2m) should contact the organiser prior to the event.



Reserve parking: Market Hall Car Park (PAY & DISPLAY, inc. Sunday) LE67 3QR. Continue down Whitwick Road until you reach the junction with London Road & High Street, turn right on to High Street, continue for 0.2mi across the railway line until you reach the controlled junction with Belvoir Road past the retail centre for 0.25mi, turn left onto Melbourne Street at the end of the street turn left into Market Hall Car Park.

By Train: The nearest train station is Leicester Station. Then catch the No. 29 to Coalville from St Margaret's Bus Station. For more information see <https://www.arrivabus.co.uk/>

By Bus: Bus services from East Midlands Airport, Nottingham, Loughborough, and Leicester all serve Coalville, there is a limited Sunday Service For more information see <https://www.arrivabus.co.uk/>

Entries: Entries **only online** on the <https://thestartkite.uk/lei/> until 4th of August, you may enter after this time up until 11:00 on the day of the event – subject to map availability. There is no cash entry on the day, dibbers may be hired online at £1 per hire – failure to return a hire dibber may result in an additional cost, to cover the cost of a replacement.

Map and Terrain: Coalville in the heart of North West Leicestershire is a former mining town and was centre of coal mining, founded on the back of the new Whitwick Colliery in the early 1820's.

Start & Finish: Are both located in Coalville Town Park, a short 400m from the assembly area. Please follow the signed route to the start. The route to start crosses car park entrance/exit and a minor residential street. **Juniors must be accompanied to / from the start and finish.**

PLEASE DOWNLOAD IN ASSEMBLY AFTER YOUR RUN – THERE WILL BE A SAFETY CHECK.

There will be **NO** manned clothing dump.

Safety:

Courses Close at 2:30pm – you MUST report to download even if you retire.

- Traffic is an unavoidable hazard in an urban event. Courses have been planned to use lower-traffic neighbourhoods, but please maintain awareness of approaching vehicles.
- Competitors are **NOT** permitted to run with dogs.
- Please show consideration to other members of the public users including dog-owners, shoppers, cyclists, and rowers.
- Competitors take part at their own risk and are responsible for their own safety.
- If the weather is bad, please carry a cagoule. Shorts maybe worn. Spiked and studded shoes are **strictly forbidden** within the toilets and the clubhouse.

Frist Aid and Nearest Hospital: A first aider can be found at download if you require. The nearest A&E is Leicester Royal Infirmary (16 mile, 27 minutes) or for minor injuries Loughborough Urgent Care Centre (8.5 miles, 20 minutes). Directions for both can be obtained from the organiser in assembly.
