I am pleased to provide the Chair's annual report 2024/25 of Leicestershire Orienteering Club.

As agreed and in line with the constitution I will continue with the formal structure to the report, which will require a formal noting of the review on the night. But as is tradition I will aim to be brief and focus on the main points.

ANNUAL REPORT AND ACCOUNTS 2024/25 of the Leicestershire Orienteering Club

Registered Community Amateur Sports Club

1. Overview of

The Leicestershire Orienteering Club was established in 1970; it is affiliated to the East Midlands Orienteering Association and the British Orienteering Federation. Nearly all our members live in Leicestershire but a couple of members live in Northamptonshire and a couple of members in Rutland.

LEI is a Registered Community Amateur Sports Club

The club's objectives and aims are:

- provide facilities for and promote participation of the whole community in the sport of Orienteering.
- to further the development of orienteering within Leicestershire, Rutland and Northamptonshire and to represent the interests of orienteers based within these areas, supporting their activities and encouraging participation within the sport.

2. Committee Structure and Members, and in-year Changes

In terms of the day to day running of the club there have been regular meetings of the club committee and sub committees. The Committee met four times during the year. The Officers at the year-end are Chairman: Stephen Chafer, Vice Chairman and Minor events coordinator Jane Dring-Morris, Treasurer Simon Ford, Secretary and Membership Secretary Roger Phillips.

The Committee is supported by two Sub- Committees: Events Committee led by the Events Co-ordinator Iain Phillips with other areas managed by the Development Committee led by Roger Edwards as Development Co-ordinator.

Most committee meetings are on zoom, which has continued to help keep travel costs and room hire rent down. Following the recent face to face events committee meeting I think it is a good time to review how and where we have our meetings moving forward. As for me it was quite nice to be in the room with everyone.

I would like to thank Roger Phillips for his continued excellent work as secretary, for the continued timely distribution of committee and AGM related minutes and other items. I would also like to thank other member of the executive board and wider committees for their continued excellent work this year.

3. Overview of Year

Membership

Membership rose slightly to a total of 113, up 5 from last year. To enable people to benefit from our club we have continued with a zero-club membership fee, which includes correspondence members. Recruitment of new members continues to be challenging.

Event Programme

As with recent years we carried on with a very active and varied event programme. We ran eight Winter League events. There were 16 summer league events, plus the Score Cup and presentation at Burbage, an Autumn club championship in Donisthorpe followed by the presentations. There were two urban level C events and four forest Level C events, plus the East Midland Championship at Martinshaw back in February. Thank you to all who contributed in any way to our events in the last year. We have continued to use Startkite for pre-entry.

Club performances

The club qualified 4th out of 8 in our heat of the Compass Sport Trophy at Clumber park in February. With Ellie Simpson, Cara Tolley and George Normand all contributing maximum points and helping us reach the final. I even managed to contribute points myself for the first time. The final was held on the complex sand dunes of South Gare, just west of Redcar on the NE coast of England. LEI came a respectable 13/22 clubs. Andy and Eoin Simpson providing the top scores. I think there are a few runners still scared from the run in.

Congratulations also to the Juniors for winning their regional YBT heat at Silverhill in March

We fielded the aptly named The One and OnLEI team in the JK Men's Short Relay, Alastair, Ed Chester and me making up the only LEI team at the event. Coming 32/49

We fielded 2 teams in the British Sprint relays, The Speed of LEIght in the Super Vet and Leading LEIghts in the Vets events. I won't mention the results

Well done and thank you to Club Captain David Cladingboel and everyone who contributed and supported the club teams last year.

Individual performances

The first championship event of the year was the LEI held East Midlands Champs at Martinshaw and Ratby. LEI winners were Eoin Simpson, Imogen Wilson, Roger Phillips Dave Denness Roger Edwards Sue Bicknell David Anderson and Don Moir.

The Midlands Champs was held in September at Chinley Churn, with Andy Simpson and Don Moir the clubs only winners.

The JK was held in South Yorkshire. Podium places were tough to come by with Don Moir 3rd in M90 being our best placed competitor.

Podium places were also hard to come by in the various British Champs, but congratulations to Don Moir 2nd in Long Distance, Peter Leake 2nd Sprint and Sue Bicknell 3rd in both Middle and Sprint disciplines.

There was also success for members in the East Midlands League in 2024, with wins for Hugh and Aidan Chester and Kevin Gallagher

Congratulation to all for some excellent individual performances in the last year.

We also have some international success this year with Iain Phillips 1st place in PreO sprint in Turku Finland, Kevin G, Matt W?

International representation

Congratulations to both Ellie and Eoin Simpson with their selections for the GB Talent squad.

Club Dinner and Awards Evening

Unfortunately, due to family commitments I was unable to attend the Club Dinner and Awards evening at Scraptoft Golf Club back in March. Thanks again to David Cladingboel for standing in for me.

The main club awards, were awarded to Kevin Gallagher Chair Tankard, Iain Phillips, the Presidents Salver and Steve Edgard the Tiger Trophy. Plans are already in hand for 2026. Congratulations to all our winners this year.

Coaching

Matt White has qualified as coach so we have 4 licenced coaches. Just a reminder to all the coaches and others to complete all the various safeguarding and first aid certificates needed for their positions

Club Nights

We continued to run a successful Maprun programme in the Autumn Term and Winter term club nights. Thanks to Roger Edwards for managing that and thanks to Derek and other coaches for the club nights and everyone who has contributed to the Mapruns.

We continue to support our Permanent Courses, or I should really say Roger Edwards continues to support the POCs. Thank you, Roger for all your efforts with these.

We have continued to invest in the club's kit and equipment (especially locks). We have provided free of charge buffets at both summer league and club championship events.

As we all know the club functions solely on the back of volunteers and all the time and effort that is put in to the club on so many levels. I thank you all and especially the Exec and wider committee for your continued support throughout the year and indeed the last 6 years that I have held the Chairs position.

As I mentioned last year, I had decided that it was time for a rest and to give someone else to opportunity to have ago. I had hoped to inundated with offers to take on the role but

with no one new stepping forward, I am really pleased/relieved that Chris Phillips has offered to take on the position for a limited period, on the understanding that we will find a replacement in the next 2 years. Thank you very much Chris.

There are a number of key roles in the club that take a lot of time and commitment. We do not put on over 30 events each year without a significant amount of work not only on the day but also in the weeks, months and indeed years running up to some events, as well as days and weeks following the events.

We have a very committed core team of volunteers several sitting on both subcommittees and main committee and we really need to support this team. I am concerned that we face the potential of imploding unless we spread the load. I can only reach out to the wider club membership and encourage all members to ask what can I do to help the club and others in their roles.

If you have some time to help the club in any capacity please come and find me, Chris or other members of the committee.

Having said all that we do have a lot to look forward to, with discussions already underway for events well in to the next 3-4 years. More on that I am sure in the Chairs look forward to the coming year

I personally hope that I can start to attend some more events. Although I am stepping down as Chair I will be continuing on the committee and in my role as Permissions Secretary, I also currently find myself in the role as the club Safeguarding officer following Alison Hardy's decision to step down, so any volunteers to take that role on would be great start.
